What is the purpose of my role?

The Branch Commissioner (Rover Scouts) is a senior volunteer leadership role that oversees the delivery of the Rover Scout program (18-25 year olds) across South Australia, ensuring a consistent, high-quality experience aligned with the Scouts Australia Youth Program. This position plays a vital role in inspiring Rover Scouts to try new things, supporting their program development, and helping them understand the purpose behind their activities through regular reflection and review. The Commissioner also supports Rover Scout Unit Leaders in motivating youth to explore new experiences and broaden their development.

A key focus of this role will be leading the implementation of a new, pre-planned method of program delivery - designed by the Branch Program Team and rolled out by you and your team - to assist the growth of Rover Scout Units and enhancing their Rover Scout program with fun.

How do I fit in?

You'll fit into this role if you love working with young people, enjoy supporting young adults, and are excited to help grow Scouting in SA by sharing your energy, experience, and passion for the Rover Scout section. This role reports directly to the Assistant Chief Commissioner Program Support.

How much time is required?

The time required for this role will vary, depending on current priorities and activities, and may involve a flexible but significant commitment.
